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WHAT IS THE SHOAH?

Shoah is a Hebrew word used since the late 1940s to describe the genocide of approximately six million European Jews and other "undesirable" people during the era of World War II. After the Holocaust, people worldwide agreed that this must never happen again. We must never allow any groups to suffer the fate of these Jews and other targeted groups murdered by the Nazi regime and its supporters because they didn't consider them human and worthy of life.
